Italian Design Is More Than Style - It's a State of Mind

Italian design thrives on **emotion**, **function**, and *artigianalità* – the joy of making. It's not just about form, but about culture – a seamless interplay between life and creation. What looks beautiful should feel beautiful – and inspire.

GFG Style embodies this spirit. The design studio led by **Giorgetto and Fabrizio Giugiaro** creates vehicles that go far beyond surface appeal. Their work is progressive, technically sophisticated – and deeply human. Giorgetto Giugiaro himself is the embodiment of Italian design: part engineer, part artist, part visionary.

Two vehicles at this stand bring that idea to life: The **Bandini Dora**, a fully electric barchetta full of lightness and refinement – *una macchina da sogno* that pays homage to Italy's golden age of sports cars while looking boldly ahead.

Facing it: the Laika Kreos. A motorhome that brings the same design values into everyday life. Sculptural, functional, emotional – and deeply rooted in Tuscan craftsmanship. Developed in cooperation with GFG Style, the Kreos demonstrates how Italian design can be experienced through space, materials, and digital intelligence.

Fabrizio Giugiaro, CEO of GFG Style: "We wanted to bring the same design rigour and attention to detail that characterise automotive design to this world, blending it with architecture. The goal is clear: to combine functionality, beauty and the search for innovative materials, creating vehicles that are not only vehicles for travel, but also authentic expressions of style and ergonomics."

Why design resonates with us: Great design doesn't just fulfill a function – it moves us. It connects technology with emotion, function with form, past with future. This is the guiding principle of GFG Style, the design studio founded by Giorgetto and Fabrizio Giugiaro. Their mission: to create vehicles that are more than transportation – they are cultural objects, icons, signposts.

Who they are: Giorgetto Giugiaro is considered one of the most influential industrial designers of all time. Over the past six decades, he has shaped the world of mobility with over 200 production and concept vehicles – more than 60 million of which have been sold. From sleek sports cars to everyday icons, from futuristic to functional – Giugiaro's work is always bold, modern, and profoundly human.

Fabrizio Giugiaro has been active in the field of automotive design and architecture for over thirty years. Fabrizio's design methodology emphasises functional elements combined with comfort. Each creative challenge is approached with particular attention to feasibility and production costs, thanks to the use of the most advanced technologies.

Founded in 2015 together with his son Fabrizio, **GFG Style** carries this legacy forward. Based in Turin, the studio combines Italian design culture with engineering precision and technological innovation. Their work is consistently visionary – often electric, sustainable, and formally radical.

What makes them different: Giugiaro designs not just with aesthetics in mind, but with feasibility. To him, a car is not just an object – it's a reflection of the human being. An expression of freedom, identity, and attitude. His designs are engineered with logic but felt with emotion – *bellezza funzionale*, as one would say in Italy.
